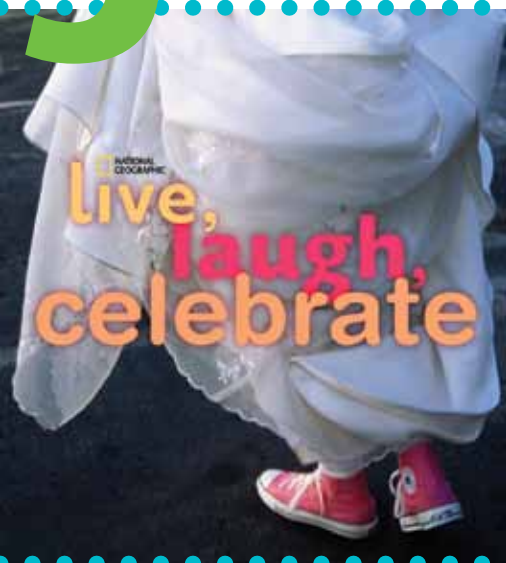

Amy Garcia, RN, MSN, a local nurse and executive director of the National Association of School Nurses (located in Silver Spring) has joined the Voices of Meningitis campaign to

encourage parents to vaccinate their preteen and teenage children against meningococcal meningitis, a rare, but often devastating disease that can take the life of a child in just a single day. Anyone can get the disease, but preteens and teens are at greater risk and five times more likely to die compared to other age groups. Peak season is December through January. 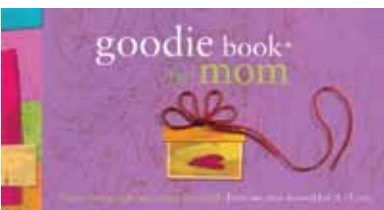


## Hope for Children of War
